Tributaries is North Carolina's only peer-reviewed journal fully dedicated to maritime historical and archaeological topics. The journal seeks to support continuing historical, archaeological, and cultural research by publishing articles directly related to the maritime history and culture of North Carolina. Articles addressing North Carolina's historical relationship with other states and placement within the Atlantic World are also encouraged. Tributaries accepts a range of articles in the field of maritime studies, and interdisciplinary historical research is encouraged. All members of the maritime history community, including students and independent researchers, are invited to submit articles for consideration. Contributors need not be members of the NCMHC or live in the state of North Carolina. Manuscripts submitted must be based on original research and analysis, and all manuscripts are subject to a peer review process and editorial review.

Submissions should be no longer than 30 pages, including citations. All manuscripts must conform to the Chicago Manual of Style (17th edition) – endnotes citation style. Please consult the Chicago Manual and past editions of the journal for citations, capitalization, abbreviations, numbers, and other grammatical uses. Tributaries uses bias-free language (for more information, please see CMOS "Bias-Free Language," 5.251 – 5.260). If your manuscript does not conform to the style guide, it will be returned for additional editing before it can be considered. Photographs, tables, charts, and maps are welcome. If images are included in your text, please also submit original images with the manuscript to retain image resolution. It is the author's responsibility to ensure copyright permissions are granted for images.
